RE- WARRNAMBOOL CITY COUNCIL ELECTORAL STRUCTURE REVIEW

The Warrnambool Ratepayers Association is writing in support of Model 3 as proposed in the Warrnambool City Council electoral structure review.

We support Model 3 in preference to 1 or 2, because Model 3 -

- Best accommodates the future growth of the city, especially in relation to population distribution amongst the wards per comments below per ward, 'already full' wards have 'above average' elector numbers, 'below average' wards will grow by infilling, and the peripheral wards will grow dramatically 'future-proofing' the wards by enabling all boundaries to be retained and the dramatic growth to be accommodated by eventually splitting the eastern and north-western wards. This would neatly create the two additional wards to bring up from 7 to 9 councillors.
- Has the clearest and best-defined boundaries, showing simpler boundaries for the voting electorate
- Is best fit for Dennington, incorporating Bushfield and Woodford in the Ward
- The Hopkins River Ward is a better fit for the communities of interest in this Model compared to models 1 and 2.

We support a change in the Ward Names to the following, as we believe this is a more accurate description of the different ward areas:

- Wollaston Ward (per Model 3) expect dramatic growth eventual split into two 'Dennington' and 'Merri North' say.
- Russells Creek Ward (ex-Brierly Basin) infill will raise numbers towards 'average'.
- Moyjil Ward (per Model 3) infill will bring numbers up towards 'average'.
- Botanic Ward (per Model 3) population is nearing 'full'.
- Hopkins River Ward (per Model 3) expect dramatic growth eventual split into two 'Allansford / Hopkins Point' and 'North-East' say.
- Merri Downs Ward (ex-Platypus Park) population is nearing 'full'.
- Central Ward (per Model 3) population is nearing 'full'.

We also support retention of 7 councillors for the city.

We understand this will have to be reviewed to 9 when Warrnambool reaches the threshold population as it continues to grow into the future.
