As well as having now achieved familiarity with voters, the current ward structure united the whole of the Greater Dandenong Green Wedge in one ward. That was a positive development that should be maintained in this review. The Greater Dandenong Green Wedge is a unique and environmentally valuable part of Greater Dandenong that is its own community of interest and has nothing in common with either Greater Dandenong Industrial Area or the central business district of Dandenong. Model 1 so abhorrent - the idea of putting the environmentally sensitive Green Wedge and a major Melbourne industrial area in the same ward is indefensible. As well as that it is simply too big - with one part bordering Waterways in Kingston to another part bordering Doveton in Casey.
