I believe that the Surf Coast shire make up is now unsuitable, with a distinct, contained township of Lorne at one end & the increasingly urbanised Torquay at the other extreme. Lorne produces a large financial contribution because of property rates. The newish council offices & the 'proposed' major acquatic centre demonstrate the spending ability of Torquay; fine if you are part of that district but of little relevance to the needs of Lorne. A similar situation arose on the Sunshine Coast where another amalgamation swallowed the 'unique' Noosa. Here the solution was to separate, but the process required great effort & powerful leaders, not readily available. Our solution should be to look for more homogeneous amalgamations as the disparities of Torquay & Lorne will continue to develop. In the interim Lorne needs strong & very specific councillor representation until a better configuration for the area west & north of the current 'centre' of Torquay. D&J Gaffney.
