I urge the commission to take into consideration the current boundaries and restructure where elected representatives are actually truly representing the area they reside in.

As our estate grows larger and larger it is imperative that semi rural communities become truly represented.

The current system of voting in the representatives needs an overhaul as the system in place benefits candidates from larger townships being elected to represent residents in areas they have no understanding of or possibly never been.

Because townships have thousands of residents there is never a chance for smaller rural communities to get local residents elected.

Certainly an Unfair current system of electing representatives.
