Please record that this submission supports Model 2 of the Greater Dandenong City Council ward boundary review. This represents the least change from the current ward structure.

As well as having now achieved familiarity with voters, the current ward structure united the whole of the Greater Dandenong Green Wedge in one ward. This has been a positive development that should continue to be maintained in this review. The Greater Dandenong Green Wedge is a unique and environmentally valuable part of Greater Dandenong that is its own community of interest and has nothing in common with either the Greater Dandenong Industrial Area or the central business district of Dandenong.

I oppose Model 1 as the idea of putting the environmentally sensitive Green Wedge and a major Melbourne industrial area in the same ward is abhorrent. Secondly, it is too big with one part bordering Waterways in Kingston to another part bordering Doveton in Casey.
