

**Electoral structure review - Hepburn Shire Council - Response Submission**

The three proposed models are all reasonable however there is a total lack of critical analysis that provides any particular reason for those three being proposed. There are literally thousands of possible models but yet we have only three to choose from with no inclination as to the reasoning behind why these three were chosen. Very poor approach to option development.

Local council must provide local representation for residents. There are four main communities in Hepburn shire and representation for each of these must be ensured. This eliminates Hepburn Model 1 as an appropriate model. Model 1 cannot ensure representation of each of the four communities because without any boundaries all councilors may come from a single family in one location.

There should be as far as reasonable (if there is such a thing) an equal representation for residents. This would mean that each councilor represents a similar number of residents within the shire. Model 3 provides representation for less populated areas and can therefore provide an imbalance in the number of residents each councilor represents.

This leaves us with Model 2 as the best option when considering representation criteria for:

1. ensuring the four main communities are represented and cannot be excluded for unrepresented in any way
2. ensuring that there is equal representation as far as reasonable for all residents

I would endorse Model 2 as the preferred model because Model 1 and Model 3 may not offer the communities and residents equitable local government representation which can be considered undemocratic.
